PRAIRIELAND RECYCLING & DISPOSAL OFFERS ORGANICS RECYCLING PROGRAM

Prairieland offers an Organics Recycling Program. Yard waste and other organic materials, such as vegetable food scraps, pet waste and landscape clippings (see their website for a complete list) are collected curbside and taken to a state-licensed compost facility where they are processed into compost and mulches.

WHY? Composting organics reduces the amount of material that is landfilled and helps reduce greenhouse gas production. Compost and mulches are used to rebuild local soils, protect topsoil from erosion due to wind and rain, suppress weeds, conserve water and attract earthworms.

Illinois Residential Electronics Recycling Laws

Beginning January 1, 2012, the Illinois' Electronic Products Recycling and Reuse Act's landfill ban for certain electronic devices took effect. The following electronic items are no longer accepted in either your regular trash or recycling container:

TV's, monitors, printers, computers (including tablet computers), keyboards, mice, scanners, fax machines, VCRs, DVD players, portable digital music players, video game systems, servers, satellite receivers, cable receivers and digital converter boxes.

What Electronics can I put by my curb by 7AM to recycle?

Accepted Items Include: Personal Computers (including tablets)*, Monitors*, Electronic Keyboards*, Mice*, Small Scale Servers*, Printers*, Scanners*, Copiers, Fax Machines*, Digital Converter Boxes*, Cable Receivers*, Satellite Receivers*, VCRs*, DVRs*, DVD Players*, Televisions*, Stereos, Radios, Microwaves, Small Household Appliances, Video Game Consoles* and Accessories, Portable Digital Music Players* Items should be unboxed.

* Indicates electronics banned from Illinois landfills as of January 1, 2012.

*****NOTE: EACH HOUSEHOLD IS LIMITED TO 1 (ONE) TV/MONITOR ONLY!! *****

Not Accepted: No commercial or business materials will be accepted.

.....No dehumidifiers, air conditioners, large appliances

What Items can I bring to the Village Hall 8AM-Noon?

To Recycle: Holiday Lights, Motor Oil, Telephones, Cell Phones, Alkaline & Rechargeable Batteries -
- **IMPORTANT NOTE ABOUT BATTERIES:** To avoid the risk of cross contact of battery terminals that can result in sparking and possible fire, residents must place a piece of household tape over the contact points on each battery NO lead-acid batteries.
- **SHOES! SHOES! SHOES! Village Hall is a SWALCO REUSE-A-SHOE collection site!** Please tie laces or rubber band pairs together. No muddy/moldy/wet shoes, ice-skates, rollerblades or snow boots. All other shoes welcome—regardless of condition!

To Donate: Clothing & Home Goods to benefit Veterans. Items must be in good condition. See below!

Accepted Clothing & Home Donations for Veterans

- Appliances (small & working) - irons, toasters, blenders, coffee makers, curling irons, clocks
 - Bedding, linens, blankets, area rugs, Curtains & drapes
 - Christmas/holiday items
 - Clothing & Shoes, Purses, backpacks, luggage
 - Electronics: Cameras, DVD & MP3 players, Laptop computers, Portable stereos or boom boxes, Radios
 - Exercise equipment (only if driver can lift)
 - Eyeglasses
 - Furniture (Small – stools, end tables, high chairs)
 - Games, Arts & craft supplies
 - Household items (knick-knacks, bookends, wall hangings, picture frames)
 - Jewelry
 - Kitchenware (pots, pans, dishes, silverware)
 - Lawn furniture (only in good condition)
 - Records, tapes, CDs, DVDs
 - Scooters, Sporting goods, Toys & stuffed animals
