Village Elections

Offices for three Village Trustee positions are up for Election in April 2019. If you are interested in serving your community on our Village Board, petition packets are available at the Village Hall and on county and state websites and can be circulated from now until the filing period which begins on December 17th. The Village Board meets the first and third Wednesday of each month at 7PM to review Village policies, procedures and other Village business. These are volunteer positions with a small stipend awarded quarterly for service. For more information reference the Candidate Guide at www.elections.il.gov Incumbent Trustees Dawn Cillo, Ryan Thomasson and Keith Vogeler plan to run for re-election at this time.

Police Coverage

The Village of Port Barrington is covered in both counties 24/7 by McHenry County and Lake County Sheriff Departments. *The Village also hires off-duty Sheriff Deputies as its police force.* These deputies are scheduled and paid for by the Village.

The Village also pays for additional Code Enforcement Officers through an intergovernmental agreement with Wauconda Police Department to help address residents' complaints in regard to Village ordinance violations such as property maintenance issues, building additions and overnight parking.

Coyotes

Coyotes have again been spotted in and around our Village. They are the largest wild predator in the Chicago region and serve a vital role in maintaining the populations of many small mammals, including mice and rabbits. They also feed on goose eggs. Coyotes shy away from humans-- however, they have been known to infrequently prey upon small cats and dogs. If you walk your dog in any open space area, keeping your dog on a leash no longer than 5' is particularly important. Do not let your pet approach a coyote and keep in mind, a coyote approaching you or observing you are not typically a signs of aggression. Often, the coyote is just curious. Simply shouting and waving your arms will scare it off and will reinforce its natural fear of people. NEVER feed coyotes, avoid feeding your own animals outside or leaving their food or loose garbage outside.

Leaf Pick-up

Residents: as the seasons change and the leaves start to fall, please be mindful not to place or rake leaves into the street—this backs up the storm drains and could cause flooding. This year we will again have Prairieland leaf vacuuming as *one way* to help remove fallen leaves. The days are scheduled for Wednesday, October 31st and Wednesday, November 14th, weather permitting. They will make one pass only by each house and continue until all streets are complete. Please rake your leaves curbside about six inches from the street. You can also mulch or compost leaves and yard waste.

Overnight parking is prohibited on **any** Village road and there is no parking on cul-de-sacs at any time. Parking along Village roads during and after snow accumulation of 2 inches or more is also prohibited.
