Shade:

<i>Actaea pachypoda</i> (alba)	white baneberry
<i>Anemonella thalictroides</i>	rue anemone
<i>Asarum canadense</i>	wild ginger
<i>Aster macrophyllus</i>	big-leaved aster
<i>Dentaria laciniata</i>	toothwort
<i>Eupatorium rugosum</i>	white snake root (can be invasive)
<i>Geranium maculatum</i>	wild geranium
<i>Helianthus strumosus</i>	woodland sunflower
<i>Phlox divaricata</i>	blue phlox
<i>Podophyllum peltatum</i>	May apple
<i>Smilacina racemosa</i>	false or feathery Solomon's seal or plume
<i>Solidago flexicaulis, caesia, ulmifolia</i>	goldenrod - zigzag, blue-stemmed or elm-leaved
<i>Thalictrum dioicum</i>	early meadowrue
<i>Trillium recurvatum</i>	red or prairie trillium

<i>Carex pensylvanica</i>	Penn or oak sedge
<i>Elymus villosus</i>	silky wild rye
<i>Hystrix patula</i>	bottlebrush grass

<i>Asclepias tuberosa</i>	butterfly weed
<i>Aster azureus</i>	sky blue aster
<i>Aster laevis</i>	smooth aster
<i>Baptisia leucophaea</i>	cream wild indigo
<i>Coreopsis palmata, lanceolata</i>	coreopsis – stiff, lanceleaf
<i>Desmodium illinoense</i>	Illinois tick trefoil
<i>Echinacea pallida</i>	pale purple coneflower
<i>Helianthus mollis</i>	downy sunflower
<i>Lespedeza capitata</i>	round-headed bush clover
<i>Liatris aspera, cylindracea</i>	rough blazing star, cylindrical blazing star
<i>Monarda punctata</i>	dotted mint
<i>Petalostemum purpureum</i>	purple prairie clover (also as genus <i>Dalea</i>)
<i>Rudbeckia hirta</i>	black-eyed Susan
<i>Ruellia humilis</i>	wild petunia
<i>Solidago rigida</i>	stiff goldenrod
<i>Solidago speciosa</i>	showy goldenrod
<i>Tradescantia ohiensis</i>	Ohio spiderwort
<i>Verbena stricta</i>	hoary vervain

<i>Andropogon scoparius</i>	little bluestem
<i>Bouteloua curtipendula</i>	side-oats grama
<i>Sporobolus heterolepis</i>	prairie dropseed
