### Plant List for Trees and Shrubs

#### Trees:

<i>Acer spp.</i>	maples – black, red, silver, sugar
<i>Alnus rugosa american</i>	speckled alder (wet soils)
<i>Amelanchier arborea, laevis</i>	serviceberry, Juneberry, shadblow
<i>Betula spp.</i>	birch – gray, paper, river, yellow
<i>Carpinus caroliniana virginiana</i>	blue beech
<i>Carya spp.</i>	hickory – shagbark, bitternut, pignut, mockernut
<i>Celtis occidentalis</i>	hackberry
<i>Cercis canadensis</i>	eastern redbud
<i>Crataegus spp.</i>	hawthorn – cockspur, dotted, downy
<i>Gleditsia triacanthos</i>	common honey locust
<i>Juglans cinerea, nigra</i>	walnut – bitternut or black walnut
<i>Nyssa sylvatica</i>	black gum or sour gum
<i>Ostrya virginiana</i>	ironwood
<i>Pinus banksiana, resinosa, strobus</i>	pine – jack, red, white
<i>Platanus occidentalis</i>	sycamore
<i>Populus deltoids</i>	cottonwood
<i>Quercus spp.</i>	oaks – black, red, bur, shingle, swamp, white, chinquapin
<i>Salix nigra</i>	black willow
<i>Tilia americana</i>	American linden

#### Shrubs:

<i>Aronia melancarpa, arbutifolia</i>	chokeberry – black or red
<i>Ceanothus americanus</i>	New Jersey tea
<i>Cephalanthus occidentalis</i>	buttonbush (wet soils)
<i>Cornus spp.</i>	dogwood - alternate leafed, red-osier, gray, silky
<i>Corylus americana</i>	hazelnut
<i>Hamamelis virginiana</i>	common witch hazel
<i>Hypericum kalmianum</i>	Kalm's St. John's wort
<i>Ilex verticillata</i>	winterberry holly (wet soils)
<i>Juniperus communis, horizontalis</i>	juniper – common, trailing
<i>Lindera benzoin</i>	spicebush
<i>Physocarpus opulifolius</i>	ninebark
<i>Potentilla fruticosa</i>	shrubby cinquefoil
<i>Prunus americana</i>	American plum
<i>Rhus spp.</i>	fragrant, shining, smooth, staghorn
<i>Sambucus canadensis</i>	elderberry
<i>Staphylea trifolia</i>	bladdernut
<i>Symphoricarpos albus</i>	snowberry
<i>Thuja occidentalis</i>	eastern white cedar
<i>Tsuga canadensis</i>	Canadian hemlock
<i>Viburnum dentatum, lentago</i>	arrow-wood viburnum, nannyberry
<i>Viburnum prunifolium</i>	black haw viburnum
