1	Adoption	16-Aug-23
2	Participation on the Hazard Mitigation Planning Committee and Plan Monitoring and Maintenance	Meeting attendance by Village employees and representatives.
3	Incorporate ANHMP into Other County and Municipal Plans	Updates of the Village Comprehensive Plan illudes to working closely with other local governments and civic groups for purposes of area-wide planning and coordinating of local services such as flood control / response and groundwater protection. A link to the ANHMP is included. The ANHMP is also incorporated into the Community Raing System annual reports.
4	Continued Implementation of the WDO and NFIP Requirements	The Village again maintained CRS level 7 and was recertified as a Certified Community with LCSMC for the Watershed development Ordinance enforcement for Standard Provisions
5	Improve Natural Hazards Public Information Efforts with focus on the Promotion of Flood Insurance and How People Can Protect Themselves and Their Property	As part of CRS certification, annual notices regarding flood insurance are sent to those in flood hazard areas and information was sent to area library to include in their catalog. A Village-wide newsletter includes information about flood insurance and property protection periodically. The third Annual "RiverFest" was held with supportive agencies in attendance such as LCSMC, Friends of the Fox, Northern Moraine Wastewater Reclamation District . A day of education, community and fun! Village electronic information sign was purchased and will be installen in Spring of 2025
6	Identify Needs and Obtain Alternate Power Sources for Critical Facilities and Shelters	The goal of generator purchase was fulfilled. Village staff and Trustees are now working with ComEd and have earmarked ARPA monies for solar roof panels on one or more Village buildings. Community room continues to be listed as a shelter available for Village residents upon request.
7	Review of Critical Facilities and Implement of Appropriate Mitigation Measures	No change: Parking lot bioswales & retention continue to be maintained to mitigate flooding in front of the Community room.
9	Implement Maintenance Programs for Drainage Systems, Including Streambank and Ravine Stabilization Efforts	Ongoing shoreline stabilization stewardship of Village properties has been outsourced to Tallgrass Restoration, LLC. Outfall inspection training was begun with new staff member. No progress: Riverwalk stbdivision HOA collaboration with shoreline stabilization of detention ponds.
10	Implement Property Protection Projects for Flood Mitigation	The Village did acquire an additional property in the floodway and razed the house there. Property to be kept as open space. Communications with LCSMC for mitigating flooding of Kazimour Drive to protect ingress/egress during flood situations.
11	Reduce Inflow and Infiltration	Grant received for planting of trees to help stabelize detention areas in Deer Grove subdivision. Plantings will be native species and will commence in the spring. Two new bioswales were constructed and underseeded with plug planting of native species to be added this spring/summer.
12	Identify Wind Mitigation Opportunities for the Protection of Buildings, and to Provide Safe Rooms and Sheltering	No progress: Still considering StormReady program

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14	Continue Work for NIMS Compliance	In progress as time/funding allows. Health & Safety trustee organized an CPR/AED training that was well attended by community volunteers
15	Improve Building Codes and Building Code Enforcement	Village Board researched building code updates and an ordinance to update these codes is on the December 2024 agenda. The Village continues to outsource code enforcement to Wauconda Police Department in conjunction with their in-house Building & Zoning Officer
16	Seek Mitigation Grant Funding for Additional Mitigation Planning and Cost Beneficial Projects	no progress at this time
18	Emergency Response	Local CERT recruitment and training continue.
19	Response & Recovery Information	Warning siren repair performed--maintenance is ongoing. Health & Safety Trustee continues working on plan framework. New Public Works truck will be purchased before the close of 2024. It will
20	Continue Participation or Consider Participation in the NFIP's Community Rating System	Maintained a Lever 7 CRS Certification. Next level certification will be considered after new building codes are adopted.
