Chili and fall desserts must be checked in 10:30 and 11:00am. Label any allergen ingredients and indicate spiciness. Bring necessary serving utensils and equipment for maintaining serving temperatures, such as a crock pot. Chili condiments are provided by the Village REC Committee. You can only be judged until your supply runs out—so make a bunch!



Judging

Entries are anonymously judged. Cash chili prizes are judged on taste, texture, and appearance, as evaluated by esteemed judges from local, Port Barrington businesses. People's choice awards are evaluated by ballots for chili & dessert. Winners receive bragging rights and traveling trophies!



Guests

\$7 to sample chili & apple desserts. \$5 with a donation of non-perishable food or paper goods for the Wauconda Food Pantry. Children 12 and under must be accompanied by an adult. Each guest receives 1 ballot for chili, and 1 ballot for dessert. All votes must be submitted by 1:20pm.

As another alternative, you can mulch or compost your leaves, it's great for your lawn! Also, LRS will provide leaf vacuuming on October 28th and November 18th, weather permitting. This service continues to be included in our waste-hauling contract! If you use this option for leaf disposal, please rake your leaves to the edge of the street. Please do not rake leaves into the street or block any storm drains or culverts. Please DO NOT PARK IN THE STREET ON LEAF PICK UP DAYS.

LRS is again placing a marked dumpster at the Village Hall to recycle *organic* fall décor. It will be in the parking lot from late October through November. Pumpkins, cornstalks, gourds and mums must be from residential sources within our Village only and must be free of candles, glow sticks, lights and artificial fasteners. No other waste will be accepted at this station. There will also be a SEPARATE BIN for HOLIDAY
