

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF  
THE VILLAGE OF PORT BARRINGTON BOARD OF TRUSTEES  
LAKE AND MCHENRY COUNTIES, ILLINOIS

May 20, 2026

President Vogeler called the regularly scheduled Meeting of the Board of Trustees to order at 7:02 pm. The following Trustees were present: Trustees Tuke, Jurkowski, Suddeth and Corrigan. Trustees Grothendick and Lawrence were absent.

Trustee Corrigan motioned to set the agenda, affirming no conflicts of interest. Trustee Tuke seconded. Roll call as taken: 4 Ayes, 0 Nays, 2 Absent. Motion approved.

Trustee Corrigan requested a change to the minutes of April 22, 2026 to clarify the Planning Commission discussion. With a specific change included under Planning Committee, Trustee Corrigan motioned to approve those minutes. Trustee Tuke seconded. Roll call was taken: 4 Ayes, 0 Nays, 2 Absent. Motion approved.

The Treasurer Report for April 2026 was before the Board. Trustee Tuke motioned to approve. Trustee Jurkowski seconded.

Bills payable through May 20, 2026 was before the Board. Trustee Corrigan motioned to approve the Bills Payable. Trustee Tuke seconded. Roll call was taken: 4 Ayes, 0 Nays, 2 Absent. Motion approved.

#### PLANNING COMMISSION

Vince Russo and Keith Kotarski were present. President Vogeler stated that Pam Hallet has sent her resignation letter. Vince stated he knows an interested party who may wish to join the Planning Commission. Vince asked about the 7-acre plot near Deer Grove. President Vogeler reiterated that it is in the corporate boundaries so the Village has first right of annexation.

#### HEALTH AND SAFETY

President Vogeler stated that Trustee Grothendick got a proposal from JS Communications to repair 2 of the sirens that are not working. The quote is for \$4,060.00 including labor and lift. President Vogeler read the report of findings on the siren done 05/20/2026 with recommendation to bring full functionality. Trustee Corrigan motioned to approve the proposal. Trustee Suddeth seconded. Roll call was taken: 4 Ayes, 0 Nays, 2 Absent. Motion approved.

Trustee Corrigan stated there was a recommendation from Secure 3 for a new router at the Village Hall, needed for Village security systems. They will submit a quote.

President Vogeler stated that people are coming every day for compost.

There was discussion of the cost and value of an elevation survey on approximately 40 homes at \$200.0 each for a total expense of \$8,000.00. The purpose would be to map for potential flooding in future and prioritize homes that need sandbags. Trustee Corrigan stated he attended a webinar

for grant proposals and discussion of a flood mitigation program. The Board agreed to table the subject until more information was available about potential grants.

There was vandalism at Fox Trail Park on Friday and Saturday nights. A police report was filed. Trustee Suddeth endorsed looking into cameras at the park and the entry. Dan from Secure 3 was present and created a proposal. President Vogeler asked if the cameras could capture license plates. Dan said it depends on the camera. The quote he prepared was for a base-line video with 14 days of storage. Trustee Corrigan recommended a camera at the concession stand and asked the cost. President Vogeler asked if 3 cameras would cover all directions in the park. Dan said it would not be a clear picture in one direction. His quote was for 2 cameras:

\$3,500.00 and \$1,440.00 annual fee for a total of \$4,940.00.

Trustee Corrigan suggested Starlink for wifi there and asked Dan about the timeline to install. An updated quote will be created to include a 3<sup>rd</sup> camera.

Ordinance 2026-05-01 was before the Board as an IGA. Trustee Corrigan motioned to approve. Trustee Suddeth seconded. Roll call was taken: 4 Ayes with President Vogeler included. Trustee Tuke abstained.

## STREETS AND ROADS

Resolution 2026-258 was before the Board to move funds to the Committed Road Fund. Trustee Corrigan motioned to approve. Trustee Suddeth seconded. Roll call was taken: 4 Ayes, 0 Nays, 2 Absent. Motion approved.

Trustee Corrigan stated he has been looking at notification systems for residents.

Trustee Corrigan stated that sidewalks on Brighton Circle were done last year and Farnsworth would be done this year. Zak will grind other raised sidewalks next week.

## VILLAGE PRESIDENT

President Vogeler stated that 2 members of the Moorings HOA were present. Trustee Corrigan recapped frustrations and delays in the project to improve the easement there. Erin Rudis and Ben Lemanski recapped their attempts to secure an engineer and expect to move forward in the next couple of weeks. They acknowledge that they missed the deadline. Trustee Corrigan stated the Board must discuss sanctions and penalties. The engineer told the Village that the HOA removed parts of the contract and intend to contract with a landscaper regarding oversight and compliance. The original quote was \$4,000.00. They removed the oversight for a cost savings of \$1,500.00. President Vogeler described the need for an engineer to oversee the project. He instructed the HOA members to return with Manhard's findings and add their oversight back in. Trustee Corrigan stated that the Board needs more frequent communication and information about next steps. Erin said she would come back next month.

## FORESTRY

New trees have arrived.

A large branch fell at Hermann Park. The estimate to remove is \$3,500.00 for that and another tree near the new building. Trustee Suddeth requested to spend \$300.00 to grind a stump near the playground. The Board agreed.

Trustee Corrigan stated that trees are falling in the path around dog leg pond. The HOA is not taking care of it. Rusty and Zak have been moving them. It's necessary to determine if it is a Village responsibility.

#### TREASURER

Georgina stated she got exemption for the property the Village took over on Channel Drive. The Health Department permit for the Port Hole has to be filled out. Georgina stated she needs assistance to complete.

#### PARKS AND RECREATION

President Vogeler stated that an appointment must be made with Cuba Township at Eastwood Court park to determine placement of the path there. Trustee Suddeth will meet them.

#### COMMUNITY RELATIONS

Trustee Tuke stated that the Village social media page gained 600 followers since the flood.

#### FINANCE

There was no new information presented on this subject.

#### BUILDING AND ZONING

President Vogeler stated that the owner of Pier 91 pulled the gravel off of Kazimour Drive, but it is now all sitting in their parking lot. Frank DeSort will be asked to contact them.

#### VILLAGE CLERK

The Clerk stated that 5 resumes were received to apply for the Clerk position. Trustees Tuke and Jurkowski will review as a committee.

#### COMMUNITY PROGRAM COORDINATOR

Donna Erfort stated that she and Zak attended a workshop for MS4 that was very helpful. Adopt-A-Highway went well. There were 9 volunteers.

27 garage sales signed up.

The Compost give-away is ongoing. Donna wanted to thank volunteers Pam Hallet and Emily Projansky.

Georgina will look into the cost for the engineers to do the MS4 and the MPDES permit.

#### PUBLIC WORKS

Zak said the old lawn mower was cleaned up to sell.

The bobcat trailer needs new tires.

PRESIDENT

President Vogeler stated that the Lake County Sheriff sent a new contract. The rate didn't change. Previous contract expires on May 31<sup>st</sup>. President Vogeler will sign it.

The meeting was open to the floor at 8:47pm.

The Board thanked Pam Hallet for her contributions to the Village.

Trustee Tuke motioned to adjourn. Trustee Suddeth seconded. Roll call was taken: 4 Ayes, 0 Nays, 2 Absent. Motion approved.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:50 pm.
